RULES AND GUIDANCE NOTES

To be read in conjunction with the Constitution

Association Name

The name of the Association is:

National Association of Left-handed Golfers
NSW Division Incorporated

Aims

The aims of the Association are:

- To engage in fostering, promoting and encouraging the game of golf in general and amongst left-handed golfers in particular.
- Promote and support talented junior golfers and other worthwhile events.

Eligibility

Membership of the Association shall be open to left-handed golfers who are members of a golf club affiliated with the Australian Golf Union or a State Golf Union and who possess an official recognised golf handicap.

Annual Fee

To assist in the cost of administration and programming an annual fee is payable by members. The amount will be set by the committee from time to time.

Competitions

Financial members of NALG-NSW and member divisions of NALGA and member divisions of WALG are eligible to enter left-handed competitions conducted by the Association.

A competition fee is payable by each participants to cover venue and trophy costs.

Golf Programme and Type of Play

The committee will set an annual programme of events and set the type of play. Where a scheduled event is not considered adequately supported by members the Committee may cancel the event.

Conditions of Play

All play is to be in accordance with the Rules of Golf as defined by the Australian Golf union and in accordance with any local rules of the host club.

Slow Play

Refer to Rules of Golf pages 49 and 50.

Dress Rules Code

All players and caddies should be aware of and must abide by the dress regulations of the host club both on the course and within the clubhouse and professional's shop precincts.

Ride-On Transport

Ride-On transport is allowable as long as it conforms with the host club rules.

Players wishing to use their own means of transport must obtain the host club's approval and comply with any host club insurance requirements.

Medical certificates are required for the use of Ride-on Transport in State Championships.

Trophies

Players may win only one trophy with winners having priority over runners up.

Protest/Disputes

All disputes or requests for rulings must be lodged with the tournament committee immediately following the completion of the round for resolution. The committee's decision will be final.

Exclusion of Liability

As with any sporting event there is a risk that the participant may suffer injury as a result of participating in the event. In agreeing to compete in any tournament organised and conducted by the Association players agree not hold the Association liable for any personal injury however caused, whether due to an act of negligence, breach of duty, default or omission on the part of members of the committee of the Association or its servants, agents or otherwise.

Distance Measuring Devices

Players may use Australian Golf Union approved GPS and Rangefinder equipment.

Mobile Telephones

Mobile phones are encouraged to be taken on the course as a back-up for health emergencies. However, this suggestion does not override any host club direction on their use. The use of mobile phones on the course during play is not encouraged as such usage contravenes golf etiquette.

Alcohol Consumption

The consumption of alcohol by players and caddies on the course during a stipulated round will be in accordance with the host club's local rules and conditions of play.
